## HOW TO PLAY:

. This game is played in teams of 2-6 players.

- 7 cards are distributed to each player.
- The rest of the cards are placed face down in a pack on the table. One is turned face up.
- The goal of the players is to get rid of all their cards.
- Players take turns and play.
- The first player can get rid of one card that is either the same fruit or vegetable or the same season.
- If he/she has nothing that matches that criteria, he/she has to take one card from the pack.


## SPECIAL CARDS (balladeers/can be discarded at any time)

- Pesticide card: If the player gets rid of the Pesticide card, the next one has to pick 3 cards from the pack.
- Greenhouse card: If the player gets rid of the Greenhouse card, the next one has to pick 2 cards.
- All season card: If the player gets this card, he/she can use it as a balladeer.
- The Beneficial/good insect card: The player gets rid of one more card with it.


## Game over!

What was the function of the Pesticide card? Why?

What was the function of the Greenhouse card? Why?

What was the function of the Beneficial/Good insect card?

Do you know any insects that are beneficial
to the plants?
Is there any real connection between the fruits and vegetables of the game and their correspondent season?

Does it really matter if we eat all fruits and vegetables all year round?

## HOW TO PLAY:

- Use the same cards.
- Each player chooses a card (without looking at it) and holds it on his/her forehead (face out).


Everyone else will try to explain to him/her which vegetable or fruit he/she is by answering questions such as:
"Which season do I belong to?"
"In which conditions do I grow?"
"What color am I?"
"What size am I?"
"How do I taste?"

And so on until everybody finds the right answer.
Game over!
